Position Overview:

We are seeking a passionate and dedicated Faith Community Liaison Intern to join our team and play a key role in fostering connections between Hagar USA and faith communities.

This internship offers a unique opportunity for an individual with a strong commitment to community engagement and faith-based initiatives to contribute to Hagar's mission and gain hands-on experience in the non-profit sector.

The Faith Community Liaison Intern will work closely with Hagar USA's Executive Director and Fundraising and Communications Director to establish and build relationships with faith communities and parachurch organizations to increase awareness and support for Hagar.

Responsibilities:

1. Congregation Outreach:

- Build and maintain relationships with local churches, places of worship, and religious organizations to enhance community partnerships.
- Attend services, events, and activities to represent our organization and engage with congregants.

2. Communication and Collaboration:

- Serve as a liaison between our organization and faith communities facilitating clear communication and collaboration on joint projects or initiatives.
- Coordinate meetings and discussions to share information about our programs and initiatives with faith leaders and members.

3. Community Engagement:

- Organize and support community events, service projects, and outreach programs in collaboration with local faith communities.
- Work to identify and address community needs through cooperative efforts with church and faith community partners.

- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills, with the ability to connect with individuals from diverse backgrounds.
