We do whatever it takes, for as long as it takes, to *transform lives.*

Hagar exists for the purpose of transforming the lives of women and children who have survived human trafficking, slavery and abuse.

When women and children that we journey with first come to Hagar, they are often traumatised from their experiences and are struggling.

They frequently report feeling depressed and empty. Some experience nightmares, while others talk about feeling numb, or wanting to end their lives. Some have physical wounds from suicide attempts and many think they no longer have value.

Any dreams they used to have are destroyed. The trauma from their experiences of abuse is like a darkness overwhelming them.

But Hagar, and our donors, bring light into the lives of these women and children.



Linh's story

Linh's father died when she was young, and her mother had to work hard to support the family.

Knowing Linh's family's struggles, their neighbour promised Linh a part-time job close to home with a high salary. Eager to decrease her mother's burden, Linh accepted this offer.

Linh was secretly taken off in a car. In a dark space, Linh did not know where she was going. When she could see the sun again, she found herself in China, where she was then forced to work as a prostitute. Linh's neighbour had made a deal with a trafficker and tricked her. In the years that followed, Linh was forced to serve customers. When she said she felt too tired, she was beaten as punishment.

One time when she was caught trying to escape, the trafficker used a hammer to break her knee cap so that she could not run away.

Linh could hardly walk for 3 months. Linh remained determined to escape and finally managed to trek through the forest and get back to Vietnam.

Linh was then referred to Hagar.

With Hagar, Linh received medical support and counselling to help with her trauma. Linh was also reunited with her mother.

Through Hagar's Economic Empowerment program, both Linh and her mother received husbandry support to raise chickens. Linh now has hope for the future. Together with our donors, we have been able to transform her life.


**Leaving a gift in your will is easy.
