Our programmes are led by skilled national teams in seven Asia Pacific countries. Through survivor care, prevention, and systems strengthening, we do whatever it takes for as long as it takes to restore life, dignity, and freedom for vulnerable women and children.

A Year in Review

Dear Hagar Supporters, Partners, and Stakeholders,

2024 brought unique challenges for Hagar in Vietnam, including political uncertainties and internal transitions. Yet, through innovation and strong partnerships, we **celebrated 15 years of impact.**

Our efforts directly benefited **8,175 people** and indirectly reached **92,805**. We provided survivor care to **485 new clients**, offering shelter, medical and mental health care, education, legal aid, and economic empowerment with a trauma-informed approach.

Our awareness campaigns reached 668,717 people, while 339 government officials and 616 external staff received training on trafficking and trauma-informed care.

This report reflects the resilience of survivors, the dedication of our team, and the invaluable support of our partners. We are deeply grateful for your commitment to fighting human trafficking, modern slavery, and abuse.

Survivor Care

Survivor care is the cornerstone of Hagar's work in Vietnam. Comprehensive care including safe shelter, counselling, case management, economic empowerment, medical care, and long term follow-up empowers survivors to rebuild their lives.

485 new survivors came to Hagar for care and support

6 survivors won their court cases with Hagar's support



711 counselling sessions with clients facilitated trauma recovery



384 survivors successfully opened their own businesses



17 survivor leaders trained peer groups on posttraumatic stress coping skills

44 victims trafficked to Cambodia were repatriated to Vietnam and received care at Hagar through the partnership of our crossborder teams.

From Pain to Trust

Lam's Story

For years, Lam endured the unimaginable. The trauma of repeated sexual abuse left her feeling hopeless, broken, and unworthy of happiness.

But Lam yearned for a beacon of hope in her life and searched for help to overcome her trauma. That's when she learned of Hagar.

Lam's healing began with phone calls with her Hagar counsellor. As her trust grew, she was slowly able to do in-person sessions.

With each trauma therapy session and each conversation, Lam felt heard, valued, and respected. She began to see herself not as a victim, but as a person deserving care and dignity.

Through Hagar's support, Lam came to see her value. Eighteen months after her first counselling session with Hagar, Lam feels hope for her future and has the skills and resilience to confront life's challenges.



Prevention

Hagar continued its efforts to strengthen the support system for victims of domestic violence, human trafficking, and child abuse. This involved building and enhancing the professional capacity of partners in victim identification, support, coordination, referral, case management, and the application of Trauma-Informed Care principles.

675,277 people reached with human trafficking awareness campaigns and online prevention videos



4,500 students trained in trafficking prevention across four provinces.



902 community members engaged in prevention events and activities.



61 communities impacted by awareness events and prevention education

Breaking the Cycle:

Preventing Abuse by Transforming Perpetrator Behaviour

Quan used to have a violent and abusive history with his family. But through Hagar's peer-to-peer prevention program, he has transformed his behaviour.

Peer-to-peer prevention is one way Hagar has worked to address root causes of exploitation and abuse.

By working with local leaders and organisations using a peer-support model, Hagar equips vulnerable communities with the tools to engage with those who commit harm, stopping the cycle of abuse before it begins. A significant component of the training is confronting harmful attitudes and teaching conflict resolution among perpetrators.

"With guidance from the Women's Union and Hagar's programme, I've learned to manage my emotions. If tensions rise or I feel myself getting angry, I step outside to cool off. That's a rule I've committed to following."



Systems Strengthening

Hagar worked to strengthen systems by training partner organisations in victim identification, case management, and trauma-informed care. Our team also mobilised community resources to prevent and respond to gender-based violence, human trafficking, and abuse.

Becoming an Agent of Change

For seven years, Ms. Hồ Thúy Hằng of the Vietnam Women's Union in Quỳnh Lưu, Nghệ An, has partnered with Hagar to combat gender-based violence, human trafficking, and child abuse.

At the beginning of her partnership with Hagar, she did not know about traumainformed care.

Through Hagar's training, she learned to listen actively and guide survivors toward solutions without forcing them to relive painful experiences. This approach has helped survivors feel safer and more willing to seek support.

She recently applied these skills to help a hesitant survivor accept assistance. By creating a safe space, she empowered them to reach out on their own terms.
